- Number of NET/SET qualifiers to be improved.

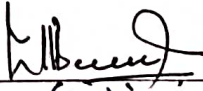

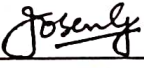

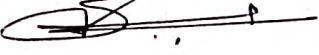
25. Audit Report of the Library

Recommendations For Improvement

7. Due importance should be given to the patent.

10. More interdisciplinary programmes need to be introduced.
11. Increase participation in MOOC, SWAYAM, NPTEL and other online courses.
12. Functional MoUs, collaborations and consultancy with industries have to be strengthened.
13. Career guidance and placement activities need to be strengthened.
14. Slow learners' and advanced learners' data should be categorized and arrange programmes for them.
